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Abstract

Sustainability, dissemination and exploitation are, however, not something that only needs to be considered at the end of a project. All partners in the project are responsible of the sustainability and exploitation and they must prepare strategy and plan for sustainability and exploitation of the project after the end of the project. This document discusses and describes strategy for sustainability and exploitation for the project. The document describes sustainability and exploitation tools for all project participants and delivers special forms for improving the reporting on corresponding activities.

Introduction

The aim of this short document is to define and evaluate sustainability and exploitation activities in the light of the valorization strategy. The document is to be used by the project partners and serves to enhance the quality of the project implementation. Project's strategy is to continuously enhance the quality of the main outcomes by presenting them to main users and collecting data for enabling enhancing the overall quality in the project. High quality is obtained by developing a peer review process whereby all sustainability, exploitation and dissemination materials are peer reviewed by all partners.

The sustainability and exploitation plan will outline the future of the IP-MED project and the use of the valuable knowledge gained from it. This deliverable reports on work carried out in the project, WP5: Sustainability. The sustainability and exploitation plan contains details about the market and research trends and opportunities for new areas for development and application of the ideas behind IP-MED.

Successful exploitation or sustainability of the IP-MED results is one of the key objectives of the project. To enable sustainability and exploitation, this plan includes the most important aspects: the results to be exploited, the target groups and stakeholders, the possible models of sustainability and exploitations and a first analysis of the fit between these results, the needs





and requirements of our stakeholders, and the sustainability and exploitation models. Regarding the exploitation of the results, each partner provided input on the exploitation plan to take advantage of both the knowledge acquired throughout the project and its tangible results. How to further disseminate the IP-MED project outcomes is the subject of ongoing discussion.

The responsibility of each partner in the project about sustainability and exploitation has been to prepare specific and local dissemination plans in accordance to the policies described in the dissemination strategy, and the correct development of these actions. There is a relation between external communication and dissemination, sustainability and exploitation.

The main IP-MED project products are:

IP-MED aims at building up ENPI South HEIs' competences in the field of Intellectual Property (IP) Law and practice, in order to enhance innovation capacities and technology transfer in the region for development and growth. More specifically, at:

- Introducing a Master Degree programme on International and Comparative Intellectual Property Law in ENPI South universities;
- Establishing an IP Law Web Portal in the ENPI South partner HEIs as a point of reference in the matter for Universities in the region.

External communication and dissemination

The essential part of the project. It is crucial in helping the project to become sustainable after the funding has finished. Information-giving and awareness-raising are key activities to ensure that even non-participating universities benefit from project partners experiences. External communication can also help to achieve a wider and more long-term impact both during and after the funding period. Sustainability

The capacity of the project to continue to exist and function beyond the end of the contract. The project results are usage and exploited continuously. Sustainability of results means use and exploitation of results in a long term scale. Sustainability is a very broad subject which in one of its senses may include topics like maintaining a website, updating content, seeking funding, building lasting partnerships, retaining staff, continuously training for staff and students for the master programme, continuously update training materials and E-Course and E-portal, Network etc.

Exploitation

Associated with the use of the project's results at different levels, during and after the implementation of the project. It is related with the necessary action that will bring visibility to the project in order to involve the target groups, end-users, stakeholders and transfer the results/products into their professional scope. Exploitation is mostly related to the idea of convincing the key actors to use the main products and services of a project. Exploitation is closely associated with the sustainability of the project after its conclusion, since exploitation activities should ensure that the results of the project are used by its target groups and possibly are transferred to other contexts (e.g. other Universities, other countries; other pedagogical areas, other sectors).

Sustainability in IP-MED is addressed by WP5, and it is of most importance for the partners and the EC. It is envisaged as a decisive project goal that the introduction of the Master in IP Law and practice, the implementation of the IP Law Web Portal and the creation of the Regional Network of IP Law Practitioners will become model initiatives for other Arab countries and HEIs, even outside the reach of the TEMPUS programme.

The sustainability in IP-MED will be assured by:

 Establishment of a joint Master degree EU- PCs. Upon recognition and approval by the relevant University bodies of the Master programme in IP Law, the partners will explore options for joint accreditation of the Master EU-PCs; (Master Programme)





- Development & adoption of long-term strategies for the maintenance of the IP
 Law Web Portal. The first mechanism towards the sustainability of the Portal is
 already foreseen in the project: transfer of the administration (incl. purchase of
 the server) to the ENPI South partner HEIs (concretely to the Coordinator of
 the project, ANNU, guaranteeing access by all PCUs); (Portal)
- Creation of a Regional Network of IP Law Practitioners, which will represent a
 platform for exchange of experiences, information and good practices with a
 view to fostering a regular dialogue & coaching among IP practitioners and
 actors at the regional level. It will also attract interest from foreign IP and
 innovation stakeholders willing to act in the region (Network).
- The Network was launched by PM36, after careful planning of its mission and objectives, and taking dissemination measures for its adequate impact.

Most outputs of the project (publications, programme, training Master materials, website resources, and incl. The E-Portal, Regional Network, which is born the very end of the project) will be maintained after the project end, as the purpose of this action is initiating high quality education in PC Intellectual Property in the HEIs which should endure.
